The City of Grants Pass (population 37,088) is a growing, thriving community and serves as the major commercial center for the county. Grants Pass is located in the "Sun Belt" of Southern Oregon, astride the banks of the Rogue River, about an hour north of the California/Oregon border and less than four hours south of Portland. Grants Pass served as a stagecoach stop in the 1860's and became a rail head with the completion of the Oregon-California Railroad (now Southern Pacific) in 1884. The name was selected to honor General U.S. Grant's success at Vicksburg and the post office was established in 1865.

The Grants Pass City Council has made building a new water treatment plant its number one priority for the past two years. Staff and the Council have worked alongside each other for the past 18 months to make a number of significant decisions to ensure the project will be delivered to the growing community.
