



Grants Pass Memorial Tree Program

A goal of the Grants Pass Urban Tree Advisory Committee is to revitalize City parks by planting trees that are donated to honor individuals, organizations, or causes.

The City of Grants Pass offers high quality trees. The trees are approximately 1.5 inches in diameter and 10 feet in height for deciduous trees, and 3 to 5 feet in height for conifer trees. The price of either type of tree is \$100.



Each tree is guaranteed for two years and will be replaced by the City at no extra charge should it die within two years of planting. It is understood that once planted, the tree is the exclusive property of the City, which is responsible for watering, fertilizing, pruning, and mulching as it deems necessary.

Applications submitted between December 20 and June 19 will be planted in the fall. Applications submitted between June 20 and December 19 will be planted in the spring.

All donors will be notified of their tree's location *after* the tree is planted. Donors will be invited to the Arbor Day Celebration that is scheduled after the tree's planting. Arbor Day is celebrated in Grants Pass on the Monday of the first full week of April.

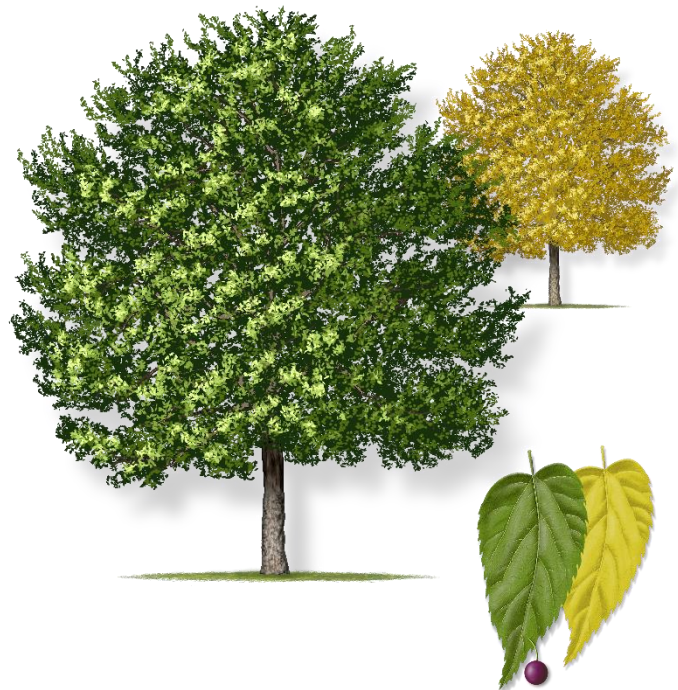

Highly susceptible to Emerald Ash Borer, an extremely destructive pest not yet in Oregon
Black Locust
Weedy reproductive habit and maintenance issues
Non-hybridized American Elms
Highly susceptible to Dutch Elm Disease
Tree of Heaven
Invasive species, difficult to contain
